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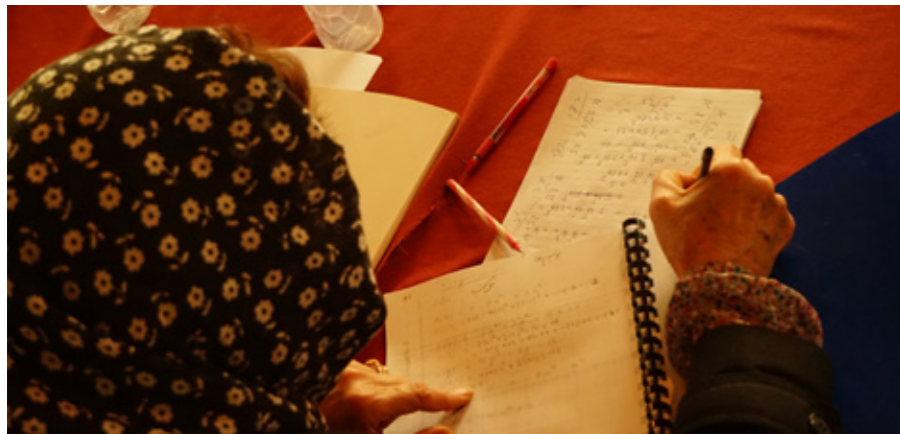
# TEACHER TRAINING

### FACTS & FIGURES

- Maths teachers have received two trainings already, which lasted for more than three weeks. A third and final training course will be held later this year.
- The 20 participants are teachers at three schools in Kabul: Jamhuriat, Amani and Aisha-e-Durani.
- Other trainings are currently being held or planned for chemistry, biology, physics, IT as well as German and English teachers.
- The training courses are funded by the Afghan-German Cooperation via the programme to Strengthen German-supported Schools in Kabul (SGS).
- SGS has been active in Afghanistan since November 2014.
